Sherelle has worked in Local Government for over 15 years, 10 of which were spent locally where she worked her way up through the ranks to Coordinator of Bedlinog and Trelewis, then expanding to cover the South Cluster in Merthyr Tydfil. It was an honour for Sherelle to accept an award for “Most Admired Local Organisation” in Wales the just before the end of her 10 year commitment to the programme.

In 2012, Sherelle took up new challenge within the Education Services in Blaenau Gwent County Borough Council managing a Collaborative “Children at Risk of Disengaging in Education” Pilot between Blaenau Gwent and Merthyr Councils. On completion of the project in November 2014, Sherelle moved into Social Services to manage the Welsh Government Anti-Poverty and Early Years Intervention Programme - Flying Start.

Enthusied with professional development; Sherelle graduated from Cardiff Metropolitan University in 2014, achieving a Level 7 Award in Leadership and Management and a P.G.C in Strategic Leadership and Collaboration. Particular areas of expertise include Programme Management, Community Development and Regeneration. An additional Diploma in Leadership for Health and Social Care and Children and Young People’s Services was achieved in 2017. Sherelle also holds qualifications in Project Management and is a qualified First Aider.

Sherelle is dedicated and passionate about community regeneration and is pro-active in the local community. For the past 9 years, Sherelle has volunteered as a parent Governor at Bedlinog Community Primary School and served as a local Community Councillor, in addition to being a Director of Friends of Taff Bargoed Park Ltd since 2013.
